

RAGGING IS A CRIME. DON'T DO IT, DON'T SUPPORT IT

Ragging, is any disorderly conduct either by words (spoken or written) or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness to any other student, indulging in rowdy or indiscipline activities which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student or asking the students to do any act or perform something which, such students would not do in the usual course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the body or psyche of a fresher.

Ragging is a cognizable crime and punishable offence. The guilty may be subjected to one or more punishments as:

- Handing over to the police for prosecution.
- Imprinting the act on University Certificates.
- Withholding scholarships, results etc.
- Debarring from University representation in events.
- Punishment with heavy fine.
- Rusticating from hostel / college.

Affected students can approach any faculty member for complaint / redressal.
